The Department of German and Slavic Studies at the University of Manitoba is advertising the position of a 4-month super sessional instructor in German Studies for the Winter semester 2017 (Start Date: 3 January 2017; End Date: 28 April 2017).

The successful candidate will teach the following three courses (9 credit hours):

- **GRMN 1120: Beginning German** (second half of 6-credit hour course that starts in Fall 2016)), 3 credit hours (M, W, F 9:30-10:20) (up to level A1)
- **GRMN 2100: Intermediate German** (second half of 6-credit hour course that starts in Fall 2016), 3 credit hours (M, W, F 11:30-12:20) (up to level A2)
- **GRMN 3200: Deutsche Sprachpraxis I** (second half of 6-credit hour course that starts in Fall 2016), 3 credit hours (M, W, F 13:30-14:20): Advanced (third-year) German class (up to level B1).

The successful candidate must at least hold an M.A. (or equivalent) in German, a native or near-native command of English and German, as well as successful teaching experience at the university level (or equivalent).

The salary will be \$20,000. For successful candidates from outside Manitoba, the economy fare for one return flight from/to the current place of residence will also be reimbursed.
